


Frankie & Her Little Pals®

PARENT TIP

Many weeds have a sticky core. Consider using gloves to protect hands, eyes and face from the sticky sap when weeding.

MEMORY, PROBLEM SOLVING,
CAUSE AND EFFECT, BEGINNING SCIENCE

Point out weeds in your garden. How many can you find? Look at the stem and flowers. Can you see where the seeds are? Find weeds that are just beginning to grow and weeds that are larger. Repeat this activity often in your yard, park, or neighborhood.
